

## Operation Restoration launched to save historic 1876 mule barn at Fort Reno, Oklahoma

**Three campaigns started to raise \$71,000 for restoration**



The US Cavalry Association launched a major fund-raising campaign to restore one of three original mule barns built on [Fort Reno](#) in 1876. The building was badly damaged during a tornado that hit El Reno in 2013.

The building needs extensive restoration, which will take months to complete. The campaign funds will be used exclusively for building repairs.
